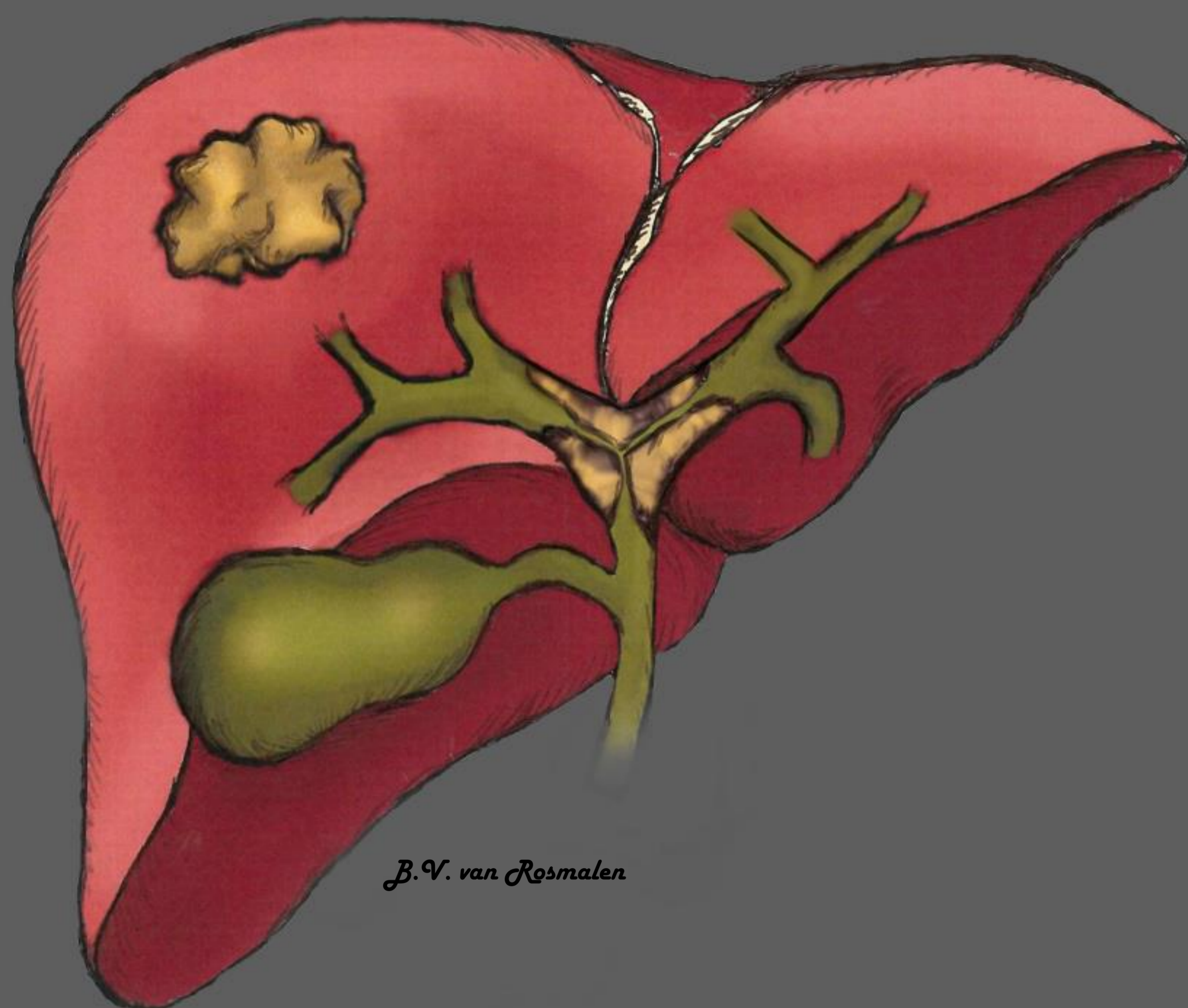

Dear colleagues,

The “One day on” symposia have become a tradition in the AMC in Amsterdam. The aim of these annual symposia is to provide an update on selected topics in liver surgery. This year the focus is on cholangiocarcinoma, and we are very pleased to combine this meeting with the 2nd Int Expert Meeting for the Treatment of Cholangiocarcinoma. The 1st Int Expert Meeting held in Verona in 2017, was very successful and called for a yearly follow-up.

The program this year comprises several issues in the management of intrahepatic cholangiocarcinoma (IHC) as well as perihilar cholangiocarcinoma (PHC). There are some exciting developments in diagnosis and prognostication of cholangiocarcinoma using genetic analysis. IgG4-associated cholangitis is now recognized as an imitator of PHC as well as IHC, and new tools have become available to diagnose this condition. The question of endoscopic or percutaneous preoperative biliary drainage is discussed in the light of the results of a recent multicenter RCT performed in the Netherlands. The outcomes of resection in Western and Eastern centers are discussed and several surgical strategies are presented dealing with vascular resection, the laparoscopic approach and ALPPS. The role of chemotherapy in unresectable disease is addressed as well as the need for effective regimens in the adjuvant setting. Efforts are made to combine the outcomes of several European centers in a collective database.

Looking forward to welcoming you at the AMC in Amsterdam on June 29th 2018,
